



The Pastor's Point

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. During this season that we call Thanksgiving, the turkeys and the family dinners and the football games often overshadow the real reason for the holiday which is quite simply to give thanks! The Apostle Paul said in **I Thessalonians 5:18** “**In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.**”

I am reminded of the story of the ten lepers in **Luke 17**. The Bible says these ten lepers asked Jesus for mercy, or in other words, healing. Jesus told them to go present themselves to the priests who would declare them whole or clean. This took faith because at that point they were not clean. The Bible says they obeyed Jesus anyway and by the time they made it to the priests indeed they had been healed! Are you following God's leading one way even when circumstances suggest that you go another way? Again their condition suggested that they stay away from the priests but they followed Jesus' lead anyway which resulted in a miracle.

Perhaps the most interesting part of the story is that ten lepers were healed, but only one leper took the time to go back and tell Jesus thank you. Furthermore, the leper that said thank you was a member of the Samaritan race which was summarily despised by the Jews. In essence, the despised one was the grateful one! Also the Jews and this Samaritan could suffer as lepers together, but after being healed they could not prosper and praise God together. Does this sound familiar?
